Spring has finally arrived, and the trees and flowers are blooming. God's world has again come alive here in Indiana. Spring rains and warm weather are a welcome relief from the winter doldrums.

Open Doors is busy with new client families and special programs. With the school year ending, our **Weekend Food Bag** program will be ending soon as well. It has been a successful year of feeding our food insecure school kids during weekends and school breaks. The program will start up again in August as school opens in the fall.

We are busily preparing for the annual **Postal Carriers Food Drive** on May 13. Teams of people have been folding grocery bags and stapling post cards to them. The completed bags with cards will be delivered to the Westfield and Carmel Post Offices the week of May 8. Food donations will be picked up by the Postal Carriers on May 13, and delivered to Open Doors that day. Then the work begins: sorting and storing the 30,000+ lbs. of food typically donated. This will help feed our client families through the summer months and into the fall.

The **Pack the Cruiser** food donation program will take place on June 3. Open Doors along with the Westfield Police Department will collect food donations at the Kroger Springmill store. This food drive goes a long way to provide foods for the **Weekend Food Bag** program that begins in August as school begins for the new school year. We are grateful for these two programs as they go a long way helping us feed food insecure families and kids in our community.

## Open Doors First Quarter 2023 Compared to First Quarter 2022

There has been an increase of families from Eastern Europe and Venezuela. We appreciate the fact that these clients are patient as we attempt to communicate with them via a cell phone translation app. As an aid for our Spanish speaking clients, a Spanish to English item list is available. These clients circle the desired items from the list.

On March 28, Open Doors began issuing plastic coded cards to our clients. The cards are scanned by the clients at check-in, allowing for a more efficient system. Thus far, the cards have been received well by the clients because they can start shopping right away. Ninety-six cards have been assigned so far (40 % of client households).

The advocate team has two new valuable additions in training.

Fruit and produce donations from Kroger have decreased. Meat is received in spurts causing the need to purchase hamburger two times in the last couple months. Thanks to Sarah and Tom, the shelf items are under control. We are out of some items we do not normally purchase so are looking forward to the NALC Letter Carriers Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive! Dollar Tree continues to be difficult to work with online purchases, but prices are hard to match elsewhere on some items.

## Another Good Samaritan Story from the Volunteer Team



A client came to Open Doors with her granddaughter. We asked the granddaughter, "What are you doing for Easter?" She and her family were returning to Whiteland, Indiana, to help a family after Whiteland had taken a direct hit by a tornado by helping clean up and providing water, snacks and sandwiches. While there, the girl had made friends with a girl her age. She joined her new friend in searching for anything that was blown from the girl's room. Open

Doors became a good Samaritan too. We sent the girl off with children's food bags, lunch meat and bread from the Pantry to give to the Whiteland family. The girl was excited and thankful.

## **Christmas Clothing Overview** – *Carrie Larrison*

Christmas Clothing leads, Amber Janes, Shawna Harouff, LeAnne Zentz, and Carrie Larrison, discussed the issue of clothing items for the children. In the past, we have given out sweats or pajamas, which clients did not seem to always like. With the pandemic, we switched to gift cards, but that is extremely expensive. We are proposing that we give out Westfield emblem clothing items this year. My Logo Shop has agreed to give these items to the Clothing Project at cost. To help defray the cost, monetary donations to the clothing program will be sought via Sign-Up Genius.

#### Christmas Clothing – Amber Janes and Shawna Harouff

Alternative ideas for our annual Christmas Clothing Program are being considered. In the past, donors have provided an outfit for each child. While we have generous donors, this effort presents some challenges given the number of children we serve. A common issue has been for donations to come in the incorrect size/gender, age appropriateness, etc. During Covid (2020 & 2021), we provided \$25 gift cards so the kids could choose something themselves. This option is costly and presents its own issues. This year, we are proposing to work with My Logo Shop to print Westfield sweatshirts (onesies for infants) to be given to each child in the program. The Christmas Clothing committee would be responsible for sorting them for distribution. George Sanburn at My Logo Shop provided the costs for items as follows:

- Hoodie (oldest kids, mainly adult sizes) = \$16.51 each
- Crew (next oldest, mainly youth sizes) = \$12.88 each
- Toddler Crew/Infant onesie = \$12.29 each
- XX sizes would be an additional \$1.56 per, and there would be a \$45 setup fee for the logo.

Mr. Sanburn recommended ordering in two batches, with the last order being placed 2-3 weeks prior to our distribution day. The print would be the same as a print purchased in the store – green sweatshirt with "WESTFIELD" printed in white. Onesies are a possibility for the babies. We are open to other ideas. Based on last year's numbers, there were 606 kids, and the split of ages was 48 infants, 80 toddlers, 382 youth and 96 kids ages 15+. Using these numbers and assuming \$90 for the setup fee (\$45 x 2), the estimated total cost would be around \$8,200. This option provides the kids with nice, new, comfortable clothing, and ensures that each child receives a gift similar in value and quality while giving them the opportunity to show pride in their community!

#### **Food Bank Manager Software**

Recently a scanner was purchased for the computer and client cards. As clients come in they are assigned a number and given a card to take with them. They are expected to show us the card to scan when they come to the pantry, instead of giving us their name. This process is working well and has saved time at check-in.

## **Weekend Food Bags and School Food Drives**

We are wrapping up the Weekend Food bags for the year, with only 1 month to go. Each



school had food drives for us during the year that focused on food needed for these bags, and brought in food for the Pantry as well. This made a dramatic difference in the amount of food that we needed to purchase for this project. We did give out Kids Bags (1 for every 2 school-aged kids in the family) and Family Bags during Spring Break to help families a little more since their children were not able to have breakfast and lunch at school. Thirty-four Family Bags and 61 Kid Bags were distributed.
