MESSAGE FROM the PRESIDENT

It has been another exciting quarter with lots of activity and programs to help us feed our growing client base. May started with the Postal Carriers Food Drive which was another big success this year. Between the Westfield and Carmel Post Offices, we collected 33,000 lbs. of food. This will take us through the summer months until we begin to receive food from the school and church food drives.

The Pack the Cruiser Food Drive, hosted by Kroger on Springmill, saw another very successful food drive raising food for the Kids Summer Meals program. Volunteers and Westfield Police helped us raise 2425 lbs. of food, along with \$1063 in cash and gift cards.

The Meijer Simply Give program raised \$8460 in gift cards. This came about through the generous contributions from our community, our volunteers, and the Meijer Match and Double Match programs. These gift cards support the purchase of food for the pantry.

Gleaners Mobil Pantry started up in May. The first Tuesday of every month, a truck loaded with USDA-provided food pulls up at Grand Park to distribute food to anyone who needs it. Open Doors is able to receive a large donation and may take whatever is left over at the end of the evening.

August brings the 4-H Meating the Need program. We will receive 150 lbs. of ground beef and sausage. Open Doors makes a donation each year to help support this program.

As you can see, we are very fortunate to live in such a generous community. All these different programs make it possible for Open Doors to feed our diverse client base with a wide variety of foods.

Clothing is the other much needed item by our clients. Kim Fingers and her volunteer crew do a wonderful job of sorting the donations that arrive in our donation boxes daily. During the past quarter, we distributed 9956 pieces of clothing. This was a 45% increase over the same period in 2023.

Bill Black, our Church Relations Coordinator continues to do a great job of contacting new and existing churches, arranging monthly food drives, and recruiting new members. The Westfield Bible Methodist Church became our latest Member Church as it was voted in by the Board at our quarterly meeting on July 11. We welcome Pastor Jack Hooper, Asst. Pastor Aaron Wardlow, and their congregation.

My sincere thanks to all our many volunteers for all their time and hard work donated to serving our clients. Without your support, it would not be possible to provide all the food, clothing and services we do.

COORDINATOR REPORTS

Advocates

New advocates have been trained. Second quarter statistics reported.

- 46,451.46 pounds of food distributed
 - 9956 clothing items distributed
 - 859 family visits
 - 31 new families served

Clothing

We have 18 volunteers working an average of 60 hours per week collectively in the clothing area. The volume of donations remains high, for which we are grateful. Our volunteers are amazing and are doing an excellent job working together to keep up with sorting and keeping the front room stocked and organized.

Comparing 2nd Quarter 2024 to 2nd Quarter 2023, we saw a 45% increase in the number of clothing items that left Open Doors. During this same time, there was a 15% increase in the number of families shopping in the clothing area.

Pantry Operations

Warehouse Operations

It's going well. Inventory has been updated since the Postal Carriers Food Drive.

Kroger Food Rescue Program

We now have 13 drivers and 10 helpers. We will be looking to add more pickups with new grocery stores coming to our area.

Food Procurement

We have added approved shoppers which has helped the current overloaded shoppers.

Volunteers

We have trained four volunteers this quarter: Chris Flora, Becca Ostendorf, Mary Gaskill, and Gary Hinshaw.

We are thankful for the people who will sub when someone is unavailable. Thanks to all who do extra jobs. One that may go unnoticed is the volunteers who make deliveries to some of our clients.

Ann is thankful for Tom and Sarah Clark. We work as a trio in training new volunteers.

Ella Goldberg, one of our Westfield High School students, received a \$2,500 scholarship from the Westfield Education Foundation, in part because she did a lot of volunteering at Open Doors. She is going to IU this fall in the field of Nutrition. Thanks, Ella, for your great help (her mother, Jen Goldberg, is an advocate for Open Doors.)

COORDINATOR REPORTS continued

Special Projects

This summer we decided to offer choices to the clients participating in the Summer Kids Bags and made a list with "meal" items including oatmeal, cereal, hot dogs, spaghetti, and miscellaneous food we got free or low cost from Gleaners. This program runs through the end of August. Starting in September, Weekend Food Bags will be available through the school.

Our Back-To-School giveaway is scheduled for August 3. We estimate serving 250 students compared to 221 students last year. Donations to date are low. We are shopping around for best prices.

Church Relations

In April, Christ United Methodist Church collected over 400 pounds of food. The weight, however, does not accurately reflect the overall generosity as there was a significant amount of much needed cereal collected.

In June, New Joy Lutheran Church donated 531 pounds of food and 8 bags of clothing. Bill was able to address the congregation to share a bit of the history and mission of Open Doors. They tied in the food drive with their VBS to encourage the youngsters to be generous and learn to have a servant's heart.

Radiant Christian Life will be conducting a food drive for the month of July.

It was voted to approve Westfield Bible Methodist Church as our 15th member church. Welcome Pastor Jack Hooker, associate pastor Aaron Wordlaw and their congregation.

Spiritual Concerns

It has been decided that Open Doors should form a Prayer Partner Group. An email was sent out to all volunteers with six people responding with interest. This is still in the planning stage, and we hope to have it all in place by September.

Many of the requests will come from the client through the Advocate, who will then pass the request on to the Prayer Partner Group. The group has a long list of others for whom they will be praying.

Our Prayer Partners include Laura Zenuik (chairperson), Anne Lins, Dianna Liddy, Karen Isminger, Lyn Nore, and Melody Wisely. We are excited about this new project!

The percentage of dry goods is increasing compared to canned goods. So, total pounds may look lighter, but needed items are still being received. With the rapid growth in this area, we estimate preparing for 65,000 mailboxes in 2025. That means folding bag season will begin shortly!
