COORDINATOR REPORTS

Advocates

Ann Godby and Sarah Clark are doing a wonderful job of scheduling our front room volunteers. Our goal is to have one receptionist, two advocates and two front room volunteers for the clothing...every time we are open.

We have trained most of the front room volunteers on how to be an advocate. If we have only one advocate on duty, one of the FA (front room advocate assistants) is qualified to step in. We also have clothing volunteers trained to step in as front room volunteers should the FA on duty need to fill an advocate place.

Our receptionists have done a good job on training the FA volunteers for the same reason. Most FA volunteers can enter the day's figures into the computer.

Clothing

We currently have 18 volunteers (9 on a regular schedule). To better schedule volunteers during regular operating hours, we are now using Sign-up Genius.

We distributed more than 40,000 clothing items in 2024. Currently, clients are allowed up to 25 items each week.

Pantry Operations

We are in the process of planning how we add TEFAP (The Emergency Food Assistance Program) into our program. This is from USDA through Gleaners and may start 1st Quarter 2025. There are specific requirements we need to consider, including a dedicated freezer for meat, dedicated shelving for non-perishables, and a tracking system. Keep an eye out for these changes.

We have several shoppers who assist Tom and Sarah stock the shelves with items not donated. Carrie is ordering as much as she can from Gleaners and Meijer.

We saw more than 125,000 pounds of food distributed to clients and other programs during 4th Quarter 2024. This includes Thanksgiving and Christmas meal giveaways.

Warehouse Operations

We are keeping up. Our goal is to do an inventory each month.

Once again, Bob Peterson is coordinating the Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive effort including getting all those bags folded. We hope to have a table set up in the back warehouse so anyone volunteering (and find themselves not busy) can go back and fold bags.

Bob has also assumed maintenance of the Open Doors van. It's been so helpful and he's doing a great job. He's taken it upon himself to replace a missing part and fix a flat tire. A good reminder to park the van inside to reduce potential damage.



Check presentation from The Mill Tavern in Westfield and Coca-Cola Consolidated to Open Doors on January 24, 2025. The Mill hosted their annual Joey's Stockings fundraiser over the holidays raising \$3000 from their patrons. The Mill owners, Christopher and Kristin Weiler matched the \$3000 bringing the total to \$6000. Partnering with Mandi Snyder, Community Relations Manager for Coca-Cola Consolidated, who committed to matching what the Weiler's could raise from the event, donated an additional \$6000. A total donation of \$12,120 was generously donated to Open Doors where it is appreciated and will be used to help keep the pantry stocked. Thank you to The Mill, the Weiler's, their patrons (Milligans), and Coca-Cola Consolidated!

All the food and front room volunteer positions are currently filled. We still have some positions to fill with the front room clothing helpers to ensure coverage for each of our open days.

Church Relations

2024 was a successful year of re-engagement for Open Door member churches. The strategy was to meet with each pastor, dust off the relationship, and propose that each church take one month a year to conduct food drives for the pantry. This was embraced. Food drives were conducted in each month January through October by 11 churches. This resulted in 4,300 pounds of food collected as well as financial donations. We've set a goal of 5,500 pounds for 2025.

Special Projects

Holiday Meals

We had more than 300 families sign up for Thanksgiving as well as Christmas meals.

This marked the first time handing out Meijer "Food Only" gift cards in place of cold items (meat, milk, eggs, pie, margarine, etc.) Feedback was very positive from clients, and it was a huge benefit for us. Not only was the project easier to manage, but we were able to use the remaining gift cards ourselves (to stock

pantry shelves) rather than have a lot of extra food that we had to first store and then give away.
